Now with the help of data science, we can predict traffic strength on a particular road at a particular time. It becomes very easy to manage traffic, once one gets an idea before the situation becomes worse. If data is the fuel that IoT runs on, data science algorithms turn that fuel into useful information.

- 1. WhatsApp was founded by the former Yahoo employees Mr. Brian Acton & Jan Koum.
- 2. It was initially only made for IOS users.
- On marketing and user acquisition, the company did not invest a dollar. They invested instead for advancement.
- 4. On June 2009, the instant messaging platform had 250,000 users worldwide. By December 2013, the figure had increased to 400 million.
- 5. The organization rejected a \$10 billion Google bid, but in February 2014, they finally accepted a \$19 billion Facebook offer.
- 6. Two billion minutes are consumed mostly on app every day
- 7. On the smartphone, 55 million video calls are made each day. The conversations last a maximum of about 340 million minutes.
- 8. It's the most commonly used application on the world for text messaging.
 It has an extra billions of users than Facebook Messenger.
- 9. WhatsApp seems to be very generous to its users because it also avoids advertising. But still, because of the billions of downloads every day on Android phones alone, WhatsApp receives \$2 billion and more by end of each year.

There are tons of to-do list apps that are available on the Google Play Store, but only a few of them stand out — amongst them is <u>Fanya</u>. The UI of this app is minimal. Everything that you'll ever need in a task manager app is pretty much on the home screen itself with a little touch of colour-coded tabs.

If you hit the calendar icon, you can see the entire calendar schedule right in front of you with your tasks for the day marked below. You can switch between the dates to check your tasks for the day. You can also add a task by hitting the plus icon down below and following that up by writing down something you need to get done by the end of the day, followed by a short description of the same and the time slot it needs to be done by. You can also add the tasks to different categories so that it is more neatly organized.

The app also allows you to set a reminder, not a lot of apps allow this in the free version. You can then go ahead and allot different time slots for your task and depending on that it'll show up on your timeline.

iPhone 13 Pro Max

The iPhone 13 Pro Max is Apple's biggest iPhone, but it doens't have any advantages over the iPhone 13 Pro in terms of features, unlike in previous generations. It's heavy and unwieldy, but the big display is great for games and the increased battery capacity allows for nearly two full days of regular use. The display gets a 120Hz refresh rate, but there's still an unsightly notch that interferes with movies. Performance is great thanks to the A15 Bionic SoC. You can choose betweeen 128GB, 256GB, 512GB and 1TB storage options. The main new features are camera-related: Cinematic Mode and Photographic Styles. The camera hardware has also been improved, compared to the previous generation. You can now take macros and the optical zoom goes up to 3X. Although incredibly expensive, the iPhone 13 Pro Max represents the best of the best in the iPhone lineup.
